cruciverbalist	- <u>a person who</u> () designs or completes puzzles <u>pertaining to</u> () <u>cross</u> () words ()
	- <u>relating to () being formed from () a verb</u> (); e.g. the noun teacher derived from teach
verbalist	- <u>a person who</u> () is <u>characterized as</u> () being skilled in the use of <u>words</u> (); one who is more concerned with words than ideas or substance
verbailm	- <u>in the manner of</u> ) using exactly the same <u>words</u> L; word for word
verbosity*	- the state or quality of () being full of () words ()
