(Latin omnis) all, every



The world consists of <u>all</u> countries and <u>every</u> person.

abs <b>tain</b> *	<ul> <li>to hold () back from (), especially from something improper or unhealthy; to refrain</li> </ul>
maintain*	- to hold () in hand () and preserve in a particular state or condition
obtain*	- to <u>completely</u> () (intensive prefix) <u>hold</u> () in gaining possession; acquire
pertain*	- to hold () a relationship through () relevant qualities; relate to; belong to; be connected to
sustain	- to hold () up from below (); support; endure; withstand; maintain
extracorporeal	- <u>pertaining to ()</u> being <u>outside ()</u> the <u>body</u> (), such as a heart-lung machine used during surgery
extrajudicial*	- <u>pertaining to () being beyond () the judgment</u> () or legal authority of a court
extraneous*	- <u>having the nature of () belonging ()</u> to the <u>outside ()</u> ; unrelated; not pertinent; irrelevant
extrapolate*	<ul> <li>to act by () polishing () or projecting an estimated value <u>outside</u> () a known range</li> </ul>
extraterrestrial	- <u>pertaining to ()</u> something <u>outside ()</u> or originating outside the limits of the <u>earth ()</u>
omnibenevolent	- <u>characterized by () wishing () all () well</u> (); being all good
omnibus	- for all (); pertaining to, including, or dealing with numerous objects or items at once
<b>omni</b> corpor <b>e</b> al	- <u>pertaining to ()</u> embracing <u>all () bodies</u> () or all substances
<b>omni</b> pre <b>s</b> ent	- <u>characterized by () being () before ()</u> all () places at the same time
omnivorous*	- <u>characterized by () eating () all ()</u> kinds of food; taking in everything, as with the mind
